

Team Gill/Hewitt Reach Career-High World #2

Released 3 February 2025 – Tahli Gill and Dean Hewitt have reached a new career milestone, climbing to **World #2** in the Mixed Doubles Curling World Rankings. This marks their highest ranking to date and reinforces their position among the world's top teams.

Their rise follows a standout start to 2025, including a victory at the Jamaica Cup Mixed Doubles event—their fourth first-place finish of the season—and a semi-finals appearance at the Fredericton Mixed Doubles Super Series. Their consistency across international events continues to reflect their dedication and high-performance mindset.

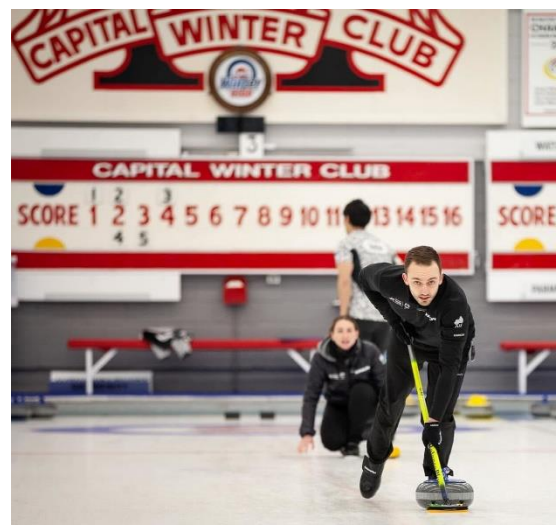
"This is an exciting moment for us," said Tahli Gill. "We've been working towards this for a long time, and to see our ranking climb is really rewarding. But the work doesn't stop here—our focus is on continuing to improve and making the most of every opportunity this season."

"We're really proud of what we've achieved so far," added Dean Hewitt, "but we know there's still a lot ahead. Every game and every event is another chance to grow, and we're looking forward to testing ourselves against the best teams in Europe."

Gill and Hewitt now turn their focus to the European Curling Tour, where they will compete against top international teams while also taking advantage of the AIS European Training Centre in Italy. With key events ahead, they are sharpening their game in the lead-up to the World Championships in April.
