

Team Gill/Hewitt Finish Second at Colorado Curling Cup

Released 29 September 2025 – Tahli Gill and Dean Hewitt have continued their strong start to the 2025–2026 Curling season by advancing to the championship final at the Colorado Curling Cup, hosted by Rock Creek Curling in Lafayette, Colorado. Held from 25–28 September, the event featured a 30-team field with top competitors from across North America.

Gill and Hewitt went undefeated through the round robin and playoff stages to reach the championship game, where they finished second after facing Team Martin/Laycock of Saskatoon, Canada. Their semi-final matchup saw them edge Team Moores/Wheeler of Golden, Colorado 6–5 to secure their place in the final.

This result follows their August season-opening performance at the Stirling Mixed Doubles Invitational in Scotland, where they reached the final in a field featuring four of the world's top-10 Mixed Doubles teams, ultimately finishing second. Together, these back-to-back finals highlight the team's consistency and focus in the early part of their season.

Building on their performances in Scotland and the United States, Gill and Hewitt will use the coming months of training and competition to further refine their game ahead of major events on the calendar.
